





- Fire in 1973 on Isle of Man
- Building with new type of external wall system set light cladding and insulation allowed rapid fire spread
- 50 people died leading to law changes...
- 50th Anniversary recently little/no press coverage

It is a cyclical me. Continuous improvement of processes.




Create a process improvement plan.





Why is BS9997 recommended by BSR?


- It is the 'Gold Standard' for fire risk management (FRMS) in the UK
- It was developed as the result of the Rose Park fire tragedy in Scotland.
- It is designed to appreciate that managing fire safety across a large stock is very different to managing fire safety in a single building it looks at the swiss cheese model specifically for fire.
- It is based around the Plan, Do, Check, Act Cycle
- You can achieve accreditation to this standard which is one way to give the BSR confidence you have a well thought out FRMS.




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





