Downgraded to G2 in winter of 2015

Orbit Group put a large number of tenants in danger by failing to implement hundreds of `high risk' fire safety actions that were flagged over a two-year period, the regulator said today.

The series of events constituted a significant breach of health and safety legislation and 'had the potential to cause serious detriment to Orbit's tenants', the Homes and Communities Agency (HCA) said.

Despite the group undertaking its own internal review and establishing an action plan that it said was 'appropriate and robust', the HCA published two assessments today, including a regulatory notice confirming a breach of the Home Standard, and a separate regulatory judgement that downgraded the group's governance from G1 to G2, which means it remains compliant but needs to improve some aspects of its governance arrangements.

Orbit, which owns 37,000 homes, reported no incidents of fire in its properties related to any of the outstanding actions and said that all properties which statutorily required alarm and emergency lighting systems were provided with them. Orbit's legal advice was that the nature of the overdue actions meant there was a low risk of prosecution under health and safety law.

However, the regulator concluded that having identified the hazards and people at risk the statutory duty to take precautions to prevent the risk of fire had been breached.

In its regulatory notice, the HCA said there had been several hundred actions categorised by Orbit as high risk, relating to hundreds of properties, that had been outstanding for periods exceeding two years.

The situation appears to have arisen following a restructuring of the two subsidiary operating associations within the group during 2013/14
