How important is 3rd party accreditation?

- Important assurance
- For both the organisation and it's residents



Safety: is it only fire?

- Gas explosion
- Carbon monoxide
- Legionnaires' disease
- Asbestos
- Lift/hoist accident
- Child safety/window locks
- Playground accidents
- Falling trees



Safety: is it only fire (2)?

- Elderly person found dead
- Suicide from roof of tower block



Cladding – who knows what?

- Clarity needed
- Considered response



More questions!

- How can you recognise a fire expert?!
- Can children hear the smoke alarm?
- Which are your high risk properties? Sheltered?

Converted houses?

Care homes?



Even more questions!

- Are there insurance implications?
- What about Regulation 38?
- Who is your organisation's "Responsible Person"?

- How to ensure repair work maintains compartmentation?
- Identify a Premises Champion for high risk blocks? (Tenant and/or staff member)
- Sprinklers/misting ?



The Hackett interim report sets out 6 broad areas for change

- ensuring that regulation and guidance is risk-based, proportionate and unambiguous
- clarifying roles and responsibilities for ensuring that buildings are safe
- improving levels of competence within the industry
- improving the process, compliance and enforcement of regulations
- creating a clear, quick and effective route for residents' voices to be heard and listened to
- improving testing, marketing and quality assurance of products used in construction
