Apprentice Recruitment

• Stage 1: Testing

• Stage 2: Interview

• Stage 3: Drugs and Alcohol Test

• **Stage 4:** Offer of Apprenticeship





Apprentice Recruitment

- 400/500 Candidates apply
- Recruit a minimum **60** apprentices each year
- **50%** candidates from Wheatley Group properties
- Trademix:
 - Joiners, Electricians, Plumbers
 - Painters, Plasterers, Wall & Floor Tilers
 - Heating Engineers, Lift Engineers
 - Administration Apprentices



Apprenticeship Training

- SQA Approved Training Centre since 1995
- SVQ 3 delivered in house
- 20weeks in year 1
- 16 weeks year 2
- Advanced Craft delivered in house
- 10 weeks year 3
- Induction
- Healthy Living





Apprentice Induction

- 7 weeks induction training at the start of apprenticeship
- H&S main theme
- Transitional Emphasis
- Basic hand skills and trade knowledge
- Citizenship Programme





Apprenticeship Statistics

- 242 construction apprentices
- 4% of all craft apprentices in Scotland
- 7% female
- 22% of all female craft apprentice in Scotland
- **5%** ethnic minorities
- 15% disability
- 90% to 95% complete apprenticeship
- 50% of apprentices from Wheatley Group Homes by 2021

How do Apprenticeships affect City Building bottom line?

- 13% of the workforce are apprentices
- 10% of the workforce are women
- 32% of women have craft trade roles
- 2% of the workforce is from the BME community
- 50% of the workforce live in the top 3 most deprived areas of Scotland
- 98% of managers within City Building came through a craft apprenticeship
